### 1. Where We Have Been:

#### A. History of Campus and Important Changes

Purple Sage opened in 1990 under the leadership of Mike Barkley. Principals, Charlie Winsor and Dr. Dalane Bouillion played an important role in establishing Purple Sage Elementary's history. This school has achieved several years as being Recognized and the last four years of holding the state's highest rating of Exemplary.
