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Paige and Perry visit ACE students

Like many students in GPISD, Michael Garcia is making his way through school. He has faced challenges great and small, but has stayed focused. While working a full-time job, supporting a family and preparing to graduate from the district's alternative high school campus, Accelerated Center for Education (ACE), Garcia was also preparing for another momentous event. Garcia was selected to introduce Gov. Rick Perry at a press conference held this summer.

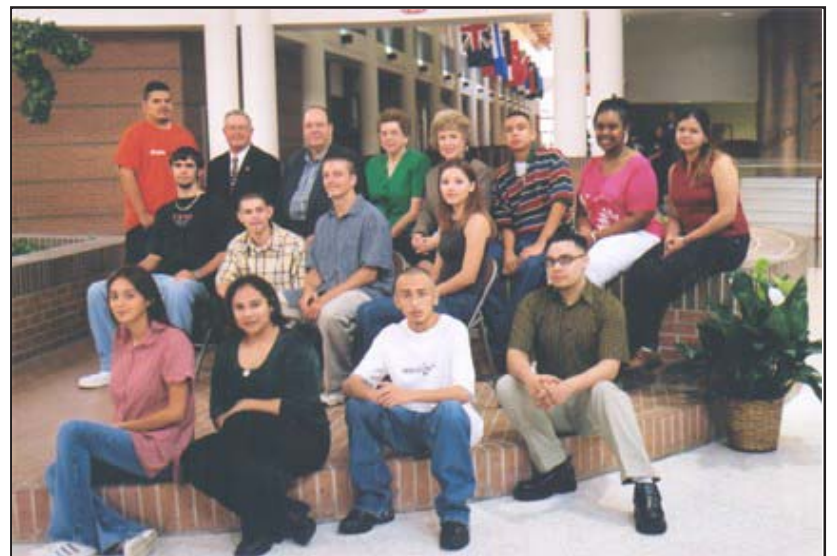
"It was a big honor," Garcia said. "One that I never expected."

Perry accompanied Dr. Rod Paige, U.S. secretary of education, to meet students from ACE. The pair announced that Texas' *No Child Left Behind* implementation plan had received federal approval. The approval cleared the way for Texas to receive another \$400 million in new federal funds to benefit Title 1 grants to help low-performing students. Texas will be getting a total of \$2.3 billion this year.

"Texas was the model for President Bush's *No Child Left Behind* legislation and we continue to lead the nation in innovative solutions to improve our schools," Perry said.

Early childhood education, dropout prevention, science education and technology training programs for teachers will benefit from federal dollars.

Perry and Paige held their press conference at North Shore Senior High School and commended ACE for providing a quality education for all students.

Perry says GPISD was selected to host the press conference because it is an example to other districts in Texas. "Galena Park ISD is an exemplary school district from the stand point of how it's run, the focus and how educators make a difference in the lives of students," Perry said.

ACE succeeds at enhancing academic achievement, encouraging responsible citizenship and maximizing employability by offering small classes, flexible scheduling, computer assisted and individualized instruction. Since 1994, over 600 students have graduated from ACE with a diploma or GED certification.

"I congratulate the people in this great district for designing a program to fit the needs of the students," Paige said.

"We take great pride in helping our students get an education and we are thrilled that Dr. Paige and Governor Perry continue to support our students and innovative programs in our district," Joyce Zotz, principal, ACE, said.

For Garcia, who plans to study engineering and drafting after graduation, the announcement was reassurance that he and his classmates can continue to focus on their studies. "I'm thankful that people are out there helping me achieve my dreams," Garcia said.

Time to talk to children about safety

While child abductions were down 4.1 percent in 2001 from the previous year (Source: Federal Bureau of Investigation, National Crime Information Center (NCIC), Missing Person File), the high profile abductions broadcast in the media this summer have put all parents on high alert.

The FBI estimates that at least 2,300 children are reported missing every day. Parents need to begin educating their children about safety issues at a young age, starting around 3-4 years old. Use these tips as a base to start the dialogue with your children.

✓ **Approach** the subject of safety in a non-threatening way. It is important that you don't make your child fearful of dangerous situations or people, but cautious and able to recognize when something is not right.

✓ **Encourage** your child to trust his or her intuition, and to be able to talk to you when something is bothering them. They should know not to keep secrets from you. Open communication is very important.

✓ **Let** your child know that their body belongs to them. No one has the right to touch them inappropriately. If someone is touching them or making them feel uncomfortable in any way, they should let you know immediately, even if it is a family member.

✓ **Inform** your child of the rules pertaining to strangers. Namely, that a stranger looks just like any other person, not like a monster or creature. A stranger is someone that your child does not know nor does his or her friends and family. Strangers will use different ways to lure a child. The most common lures are: pretending to look for a lost dog, having candy/money for the child if they go to their car with them, telling the child that they'll hurt family members if they do not comply, and asking for directions. **Let your child know that adults DO NOT ask children for help nor do they threaten them.** If they do encounter any of these situations they should immediately scream, "NO," and run as quickly as they can in the opposite direction and try to find a trusted adult. They should never approach an unknown car or get into a car with an adult that they do not know. If someone tries to grab them the child should scream, "THIS IS NOT MY PARENT!" to attract attention.

✓ **Share** an easily-remembered secret **CODE WORD**. Tell your child

that if anyone approaches them and says that they are a family friend and that they need to take them somewhere (sometimes they say that a parent is hurt and in the hospital or there's a family emergency), your child must ask for the code word. If the person really is a friend, they will know it. If they don't know it then your child should run away as quickly as possible.

✓ **Never** outwardly label your child's clothing, backpack, or other personal items with their name. An abductor could use this information to try to gain trust in your child.

✓ **Give** your child instructions on what to do if they get separated from you in a mall, supermarket, or other public place. Tell them to go to a check-out counter, information desk, or to approach a security officer or mother with children and let them know that they are lost and looking for their parent(s). Make sure that your child knows his or her full name, address, phone number, and the place where you work or can be contacted, as well as how to dial 911, make collect calls, and dial the operator on a pay phone.

✓ **Know** where your child is at all times, and keep a list of their friends, addresses, and phone numbers.

✓ **Keep** a record of your child's personal and medical information on-hand in case of emergency. Make sure they are fingerprinted and that you have a recent photo of available at all times. Remember to update your records every 6-12 months because of your child's growth.

✓ **Try** not to panic if your child is missing. First check everywhere in the house, then check with the neighbors and your child's friends. If you still cannot locate them, immediately call the police.

Applications for Free and Reduced Lunches Now Available

The Galena Park ISD Student Nutrition Department has released its policy for providing free and reduced price meals for children under the National School Breakfast and School Lunch Programs. Each campus and the central administration building has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

Students will receive application forms when they return to school on Aug. 19. To apply for free and reduced-price meals, households only need to complete one application form and return it to the school cafeteria. Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-priced meal policy, the secretary of Student Nutrition will review applications and determine eligibility based on household size and income. Immunization Information

Students entering GPISD should have the following immunizations:

1. Hepatitis B (Hep B)
2. Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP)
3. H. influenza type b (Hib)
4. Inactivated Polio (IPV)

5. Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
6. Varicella (VAR)
7. Pneumococcal Conjugate (PCV)

All immunizations should be completed by the first day of attendance. However, if this is not possible, a child may be provisionally enrolled and allowed to attend a child care facility or school, provided at least one immunization in the series has been received. For the Hepatitis B vaccine, for example, all infants should receive the first dose soon after birth and before hospital discharge; the first dose may also be given by the age of 2 months if the infant's mother is HBsAg-negative. Only monovalent hepatitis B vaccine can be used for the birth dose. The second dose is recommended at the age 1-2 months and the vaccination series should be completed (third or fourth dose) at age 6 months.

The Almatha Clark Taylor School-Based Health Clinic at Cloverleaf Elementary can assist parents in securing early immunizations for their child or children. Please call before going to the clinic at 713-330-8426 to ensure service. Service is determined by the number of available staff, demand and space.
