Curriculum	North Shore Middle School utilizes high-quality curriculum that supports student success. Forms of Academic Assessments	North Shore Middle School has common formative assessments that every teacher gives. No matter the teacher, each child is assessed via the same assessment provided by TEKS Resource System which models each assessment after the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness or STAAR test. Previous STAAR tests are released and utilized for assessment and instruction in addition to other curriculums. State testing information and results will be shared by TEA parent portal and/or Skyward.
