Groundbreaking Ceremonies Held for Galena Park ISD Schools

Groundbreaking ceremonies were held in May for the first two GPISD schools which will be rebuilt as part of the Bond 2016-Phase 1. Galena Park Elementary (GPE) broke ground on May 16, the same day as the school's 85th anniversary celebration. PBK Architects was named as the architect firm for GPE in December 2016, and at the May 2017 Board of Trustees meeting, Satterfield and Pontikes Construction, Inc. was awarded the construction contract. On May 23rd. groundbreaking took place at North Shore Elementary (NSE). Huckabee Architects have been designing their replacement building, and Drymalla Construction Company was awarded the NSE construction contract during the May board meeting.

North Shore Senior High 10th Grade Center and Woodland Acres Elementary are also part of Phase 1






of Bond 2016. They will have their groundbreaking ceremonies in June. Construction on these four schools will begin this summer along with numerous renovations and upgrades to many other district campuses.

These projects are all part of Bond 2016, which Galena Park ISD community members approved on May 7, 2016. This \$290 million package includes the rebuilding of six elementary campuses, a North Shore Senior High 10th Grade Center, renovations / upgrades to other campuses and facilities and

acquiring land for future facilities.

BEFORE A HURRICANE

- Build an emergency kit
- Make a family communications plan
- Learn community hurricane evacuation routes

DURING A HURRICANE

- Listen to the radio or TV for information
- Secure your home and secure outdoor objects or bring them indoors
- Avoid using the phone except for serious emergencies

AFTER A HURRICANE

- Continue listening to a NOAA Weather Radio or the local news for the latest updates
- Inspect your home for damage and take pictures of any damage (inside and out) for insurance purposes
- Drive only if necessary and avoid flooded roads

BASIC DISASTER SUPPLIES KIT

- Water one gallon of water per person, per day for at least three days for drinking and sanitation
- Food at least a three day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First-aid kit
- A whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener for food
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger


