



Student Parking Information:

Parking Stickers: High school students desiring to operate vehicles on campus must produce verification of a current Texas Driver's License, and liability insurance before they are issued a parking permit and allowed to operate a vehicle on campus or any district facility. Vehicles on Campus
Vehicles parked on school property are under the jurisdiction of the school.

The school reserves the right to search any vehicle if reasonable suspicion exists to do so. Students have full responsibility for the security of their vehicles and will make certain they are locked and that keys are not given to others. Students will be held responsible for any prohibited objects or substances, such as alcohol, drugs, and weapons that are found in their cars and will be subject to disciplinary action. Searches of vehicles, as well as general searches of school property, may be conducted at any time if there is reasonable suspicion to do so, with or without the presence of the student. If the vehicle subject to search is locked, the student shall be asked to unlock the vehicle. If the student refuses, the District shall contact the student's parent(s). If parent(s) also refuse to permit the vehicle to be searched, the District may contact local law enforcement officials and turn the matter over to them.

Students are also responsible for parking vehicles legally. If parked illegally, the vehicle is subject to being towed at the expense of the owner. The principal shall have the discretion to set eligibility for parking on campus.
