

Galena Park I.S.D.

The Galena Park Independent School District is located east of Houston. It encompasses the incorporated cities of Galena Park, Jacinto City, and a portion of Houston as well as a large area of unincorporated Harris County.

Within the district, serving a population of approximately 21,000, there is one early childhood center, 15 elementary schools (K-5), one sixth-grade school, two middle schools (6-8), two middle schools (7-8), six high schools (two 9-12, one 9, one 10, and one 11-12) including an Early College High School and an Accelerated Center for Education. The district also provides a PEP Child Development Center, a Center for Success, and a Community Night School and participates in a Multi-District Alternative School.

Located just 25 miles from downtown Houston, Galena Park is surrounded by four community colleges and five four-year colleges or universities.

A Profile of Galena Park High School

Galena Park High School was established in 1928 when its name was changed from Clinton High School. Two years later, Galena Park ISD was formed. In 1947, GPISD opened De-ment Field to serve the athletic needs, and with the continued growth of the district, a new larger high school building was opened on March 17, 1950. In 2004, the school was re-modeled, adding three new buildings and technology updates.

CURRICULUM

- ◇ A strong academic program with more than 200 possible course selections including a modern and extensive career and technology curriculum, electives in art, speech, theater, journalism, music, foreign languages, English, science, social studies, and math
- ◇ UIL sponsored athletic programs for young men and women, and co-curricular programs including choir, band, drill team, color guard, student government, interest and academic clubs
- ◇ College entrance testing information, NCAA Clearinghouse information and scholarship information available through counselors
- ◇ Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education, ESOL instruction, and advanced honors, advanced placement and dual credit classes
- ◇ Extensive CTE program offerings in multiple Programs of Study, including: Animal Sciences, Automotive, A/V Technology, Animation, Business Management, Commercial Photography, Culinary Arts, Education, Engineering, Graphic Design, Health Science, Law Enforcement, Robotics, and Welding.
- ◇ Advanced Placement courses available beginning in 9th grade, with 18 courses to choose from including: English Literature, English Language, Spanish Literature, Spanish Language, French Language, Human Geography, World History, US History, Government, Macroeconomics, Psychology, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Environmental Science, Art History, Studio Art, and Music Theory
- ◇ Coordination with San Jacinto College to offer Dual Credit classes and a Modified Early College Admission program allowing students to graduate from GPHS with college hours up through the completion of an Associate of Arts degree. Typically, students are eligible to take up to 2 classes (6 college hours) their Sophomore year, and up to 8 classes (24 college hours) each of their Junior and Senior years in both academic and technical fields, including: Air Conditioning/Heating, Cosmetology, Diesel, Electrical, Medical Assisting, Pharmacy, Pipefitting, Plumbing, and Welding.
- ◇ Average ACT score 22-23 (last available data): 17.8
- ◇ Average SAT score 21-22 (last available data): 1045
- ◇ AP Exam passing rate 21-22 (last available data): 37.8%
