The Board of Trustees of Galena Park Independent School District met for a Regular Meeting on Tuesday, October 12, 2021, with the following members present: President, Jeff Miller; Vice President, Adrian Stephens; Secretary, Noe Esparza; Trustees: Wanda Heath Johnson, Ramon Garza, Norma Hernandez, Herbert Alexander Sanchez and Dr. John Moore, Superintendent of Schools. Elizabeth Valdez recorded the minutes. Herbert Alexander Sanchez, had an emergency and had to leave the meeting during the presentation of the Academic Spotlight, he was not present to vote for any of the action items, and Executive Session.

REGULAR MEETING: At 6:00 p.m., Mr. Miller called the meeting to order. Jeff Miller opened the meeting with a prayer, Cunningham Middle School LOTC color guard presented the pledges to the American and Texas flags.
