# GALENA PARK INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

The Board of Trustees of Galena Park Independent School District met for a Regular Meeting on Monday, January 11, 2021 with the following members present: President, Ramon Garza; Vice President, Jeff Miller; Secretary, Adrian Stephens; Trustees: Wilfred J. Broussard, Jr., Wanda Heath Johnson, Noe Esparza, Norma Hernandez and Dr. John Moore, Superintendent of Schools. Elizabeth Valdez recorded the minutes.

- 4. Consider approval of the purchase of Lightspeed Relay licenses for district computers from CDW Government LLC via The Interlocal Purchasing System (TIPS) Purchasing Cooperative Contract #180503, for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2021 at an estimated amount of \$120,000.

- 8. Consider approval of the purchase of products and services for Advance Placement examinations for September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021, from College Board as a sole source vendor, at an estimated amount of \$100,000.
- Consider approval of Education Elements Master Service Agreement to support Galena Park Independent School District through the planning phase of our Math Innovation Zone (MIZ)/Blended Learning Grant Program (BLGP) implementation including strategy sessions and teacher workshops for a total cost of \$54,000.00.
