Services Offered

- Journeys (K-5)
 - an inclusion program for students in kindergarten through fifth grade
 - designed to serve the top four to seven percent of the student population at each grade level on each campus
- Encounters (4-9)
 - a pull out program for students in fourth and fifth grades – becomes an actual class from sixth through ninth grade
 - designed to serve the top three to five percent of the student population at each grade level in the entire district
- Pre-AP/AP/Dual Credit (6-12)
 - courses offered from sixth through twelfth grade

How are services provided?

- Journeys & Pre-AP/AP/Dual Credit
 - Cluster grouping
 - Differentiation within the classroom
 - > Project Based Learning
 - Envision/Texas Performance Standards Project
 - one required per semester
 - > Pre-AP/AP/Dual Credit is open enrollment

How are services provided?

• Encounters

- > curriculum separate from that of the normal classroom
- students are required to complete various products of professional quality
- > a research paper is required of every student
- services also include meeting the social and emotional needs of the gifted child

What are the goals?

- Develop higher level thinking and problem solving skills
- Grow students' ability to conduct research
- Nurture and develop creative thinking
- Promote affective development
- Encourage continued advancement with communication skills

Why do we offer these services?

- Federal Law
- State Law
- District Policy

Most importantly, it's the right thing to do for our students!

New Student Testing

- Any student transferring to GPISD having been served as G/T in another district must be re-assessed within 30 days of enrollment
- Initial testing happens during the 1st three weeks of school
- Testing occurs throughout the year for any new enrollees
 - Please pay attention to this during enrollment of new students

Kindergarten

- Kindergarten testing takes place in November and December
- Students are testing to be placed in Journeys
- Selection will be late 1st/early 2nd semester.
- Kindergarten students identified for G/T services must receive differentiated instruction and complete a 2nd semester project
- Initial screening will occur with a common assessment – recommendations accepted

First & Third Grades

- Testing will take place in January, February, and March
- First Grade
 - any student not currently in Journeys can test to receive G/T services through Journeys
- Third Grade
 - ALL students are eligible to test testing will be for students to receive G/T services through Journeys and Encounters
 - All current Journeys students will be assessed for Encounters
- Initial screening will occur with a common assessment – recommendations accepted

Second Grade

- All GPISD second graders will be tested in the 2nd semester using the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) online
- Testing is offered in both English and Spanish
- These test scores are great for use with students of all levels (www.hmhco.com/cogat/cogatprofile)
- Students who meet the criteria set by the selection committee will receive further testing in April or May – no recommendations accepted as all students will have received testing for G/T services

Fourth through Eighth Grades

- Testing will take place in April and May
- Any student that is not already in Encounters can test
 - students are testing for Encounters (fifth through eighth) and for Journeys (fourth grade only)

GT Testing Referrals

- Accepted starting at the beginning of the school year
- School personnel must use the Student
 Profile Form to nominate a student
